

Branches of Government Lesson Plan for High School

Preparation

- · Print out a vocabulary board for each student to use throughout unit
 - o Laminate or place in page protector
- Books
 - o Print out, laminate, and bind
 - o OR your students can listen to the pre-recorded version
- Vocabulary cards
 - Print out a set of cards onto cardstock and laminate
 - Make one set for each student and also one for the teacher to use in I Spy games

Preassessment (do day 1 before starting lesson)

- Choose the form of the assessment that best fits the learning level of your students
- · Give the assessment to assess what your students may already know
- I cannot emphasize enough how important this step is. If you want to see growth, this preassessment is so important!!

Teaching Tips

- Color Coding: this is a really easy way to add more structure to a matching activity. Outline or color in an empty box or sorting label. Outline or color in the corresponding picture symbols the same colors. Becomes a color matching task.

Read or listen to a recording of the book (10 minutes)	Read through the story, asking lots of questions Continue to make connections between book and vocabulary board	book Vocabulary board
Vocabulary cards Spy Game (10 minutes)	I play this game, or variations of it the first few days Determine how many cards your students can handle in front of them. This can vary, some students may be able to have all the cards, so may only be able to handle a field of 3-5. Since this is the first time playing this game, I make it easy. Hold up a card, and have students find the matching one and hold it up. Discuss relevant points on the card O You can also play this game in this manner having them find the symbol on their vocabulary board.	Vocabulary cards (student set and teacher set) Vocabulary board

The Executive Office of the President (EOP) is another part of the executive branch. The EOP is made up of mainly the White House staff and helps to keep things running smoothly.



The Department of Justice is led by the Attorney General and is responsible for enforcing the law and making sure everyone is safe. With the help of the FBI and US Marshalls, it oversees the entire justice system.

The Senate is made up of 100 members, two from every state. Each Senator is elected for a 6 year term, and like the Representatives, can be re-elected over and over again.

The Supreme Court mainly hears very important cases that come from lower courts. One thing the Supreme court looks at in these cases is whether or not the Judicial Process was followed.



Another check in place is Congress's ability to impeach the President. If Congress feels the President is doing something wrong, they can vote to remove the President from office.














17 page book on Legislative Process

It all starts with an idea. A Senator may have idea, a Representative may have an idea, any citizen (even you!) can have an idea.



When an idea is sponsored, it is written up into a bill to be presented to Congress. A Senator or Representative must strongly believe in this idea to sponsor it.




If the majority of the members of Congress vote to pass the bill in both the House and the Senate, it will go to the President for final approval.




