# Communication Board

  - Use the boards for a game of Bingo· Yes, every student will have the same board, but that rarely causes a problem
  - Just print a second copy to cut apart into calling cards.







## Turkey Facts

- This activity is meant to assess if students' comprehension of the story and main facts about turkeys
- If the facts pertains to a turkey, the student should glue a picture of a turkey in the blank box next to the fact.
- Great to use as a pre and post assessment
- Color and BW versions included
- Differentiate
- For students who need more visual structure, outline the empty boxes in green if it is a turkey fact and outline the turkey pictures in green
- Options for use
  - Print on card stock and laminate
  - Add Velcro to create an



- This is used to review the major parts of a turkey.
- Students cut out labels and paste in blank boxes.
- Color when done.
- Differentiate
  - For your non-readers and students who need more visual structure, outline the empty boxes and corresponding body part label the same color.
  - Becomes a color matching task
  - To make it even more noticeable, color in the entire box rather than just outline.
  - Try doing the worksheet more than once and try to fade the amount of support you need to provide.


# Where is the Turkey?

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#### Teacher Option
