These literacy units are something I created and started using in my classroom. I had students with significant challenges and most were **non-readers**. This is a great way to expose all students to some great books.


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In a separate file, there are directions and links to digital versions of these activities.

This unit comes with a storyboard.


Storyboards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.


Cut out pictures and glue in circle map on previous page showing things to remember when going owling.














There is a circle map of things to remember when you go owling. There is an option that only has correct answers and one that has wrong answers mixed in.




There are places that you should be quiet and places you can be loud.




This is a sorting activity looking at places you need to be quiet and places it is okay to be loud. There are suggestions for differentiation.



All birds have feathers. But not all birds can fly. Sort the following birds into the correct column. Not sure? Put it on the middle line.






Students will sort birds that can and cannot fly.
