

Branches of Government Lesson Plan

Preparation

- · Print out a vocabulary board for each student to use throughout unit
 - o Laminate or place in page protector
- Book
 - o Print out, laminate, and bind
 - o OR your students can listen to the pre-recorded version

Preassessment (do day 1 before starting lesson)

- . Choose the form of the assessment that best fits the learning level of your students
- · Give the assessment to assess what your students may already know
- I cannot emphasize enough how important this step is. If you want to see growth, this preassessment is so important!!

Teaching Tips

- Color Coding: this is a really easy way to add more structure to a matching activity. Outline or color in an empty box or sorting label. Outline or color in the corresponding picture symbols the same colors. Becomes a color matching task.

 - b. My copies were also helpful as either a model for students who needed more support or as a way for more advanced students to self-check their work.
- Options for Use: Turn any activity into a reusable file folder activity by laminating and adding Velcro.


A quick look at what you will do each day

Activity	Notes	Materials
Read the book (10 minutes)	 Read through the story, asking lots of questions Continue to make connections between book and vocabulary board 	Book Vocabulary board
Vocabulary board <mark>matching</mark> (10 minutes)	 Hold a symbol from the board you cut out so the students can see it Describe it as best you can. Have students place their counter or other marker on the symbol that matches the one you are holding up. There is a 26-page book with simple text and engaging photos.


The President is in charge of keeping our country safe and in charge of all our military troops.



It comes in pdf version as well as a voice recorded PowerPoint (so you don't have to print it out.) There is also a movie version you can use in google slides.


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




There are 3 branches of government.






The Judicial Branch is made up of the Supreme Court.


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
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
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The social story also comes in this black and white version. Suggestions for differentiation are included.




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
This unit also includes digital versions of the activities.
