This unit has 5 activities to go with this book to last a full week of instruction.









What is a Miracle?

- 2. Ruby Graupera-Cassimiro came back to life. She had no pulse for 45 minutes when her heart started to beat again on its own.
- 3. President Jimmy Carter was diagnosed with brain cancer. He was not expected to live for very long. But, this past December, with the help of doctors and medications, he announced his cancer was completely gone.
- 4. After being in a wheelchair for 22 years, Delia was able to walk again after attending a prayer service by Pastor Morr



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


Time to vote!! Do you believe in miracles?







Students will read a passage about miracles and then vote on whether or not they believe in them. There are suggestions for group activities with the results for the vote.



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
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



Place some of the pictures in circle map showing some things you know about poinsettias.




