
This unit has 29 pages plus 12 google slides. There are 5 activities to go with this book to last a full week of instruction.














































This unit comes with a storyboard.

Cut out pictures and glue in circle map on previous page ONLY IF they are ways to hear snow.


























There is a circle map about sounds you hear in the snow. There is an option that only has correct answers and one that has wrong answers mixed in.








Students will turn ordinary sentences into one that contains onomatopoeia.

































This is a sorting activity looking at sounds that are loud vs quiet. There are suggestions for differentiation included.

Students will write a story about what they hear in the snow using onomatopeia. This is an errorless activity that allows students to write their own story independently.












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There are digital versions of the activities included. Students click and drag the answers.
