This unit has 32 pages plus 14 google slides. There are 5 activities to go with this book as well as a storyboard to use for group discussions.



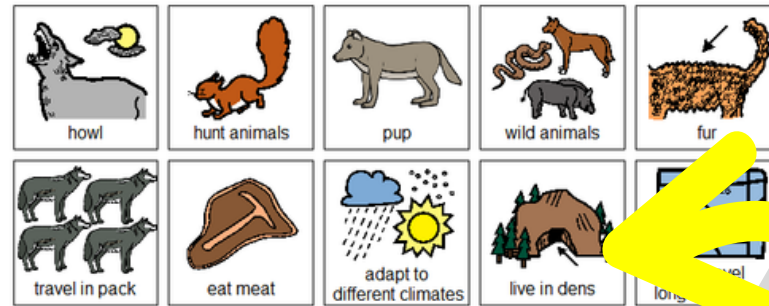
This unit comes with a storyboard.

Storyboards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

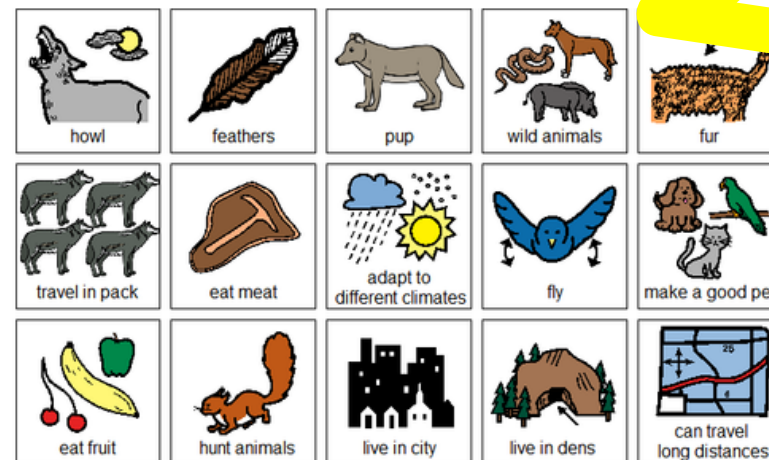
Tips on how to use in the unit!!

An option that has wrong answers mixed in students will need to set aside.

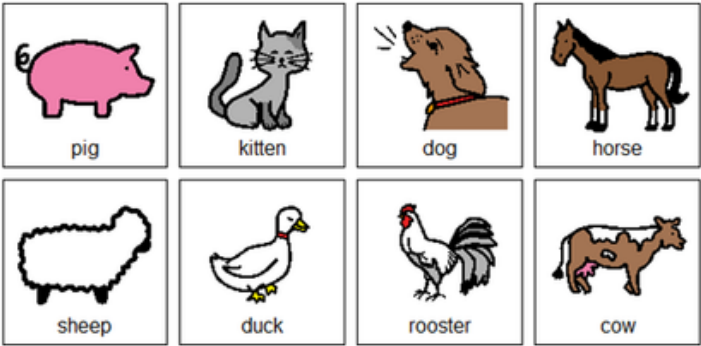


Read or listen to the following sounds. Find that object that makes them on the next page.

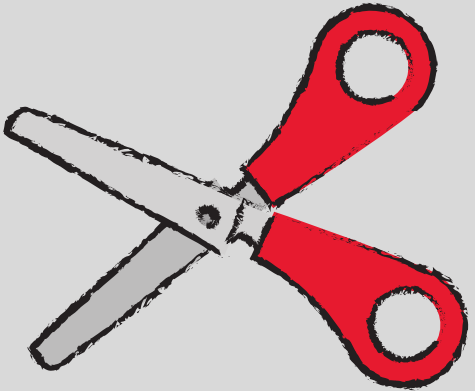

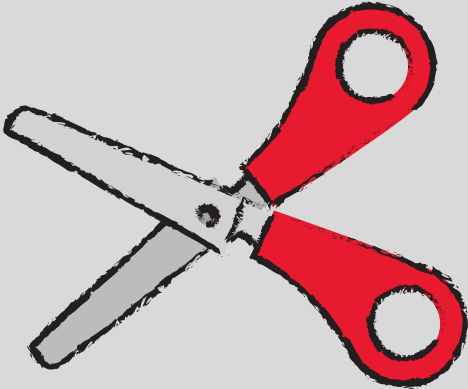

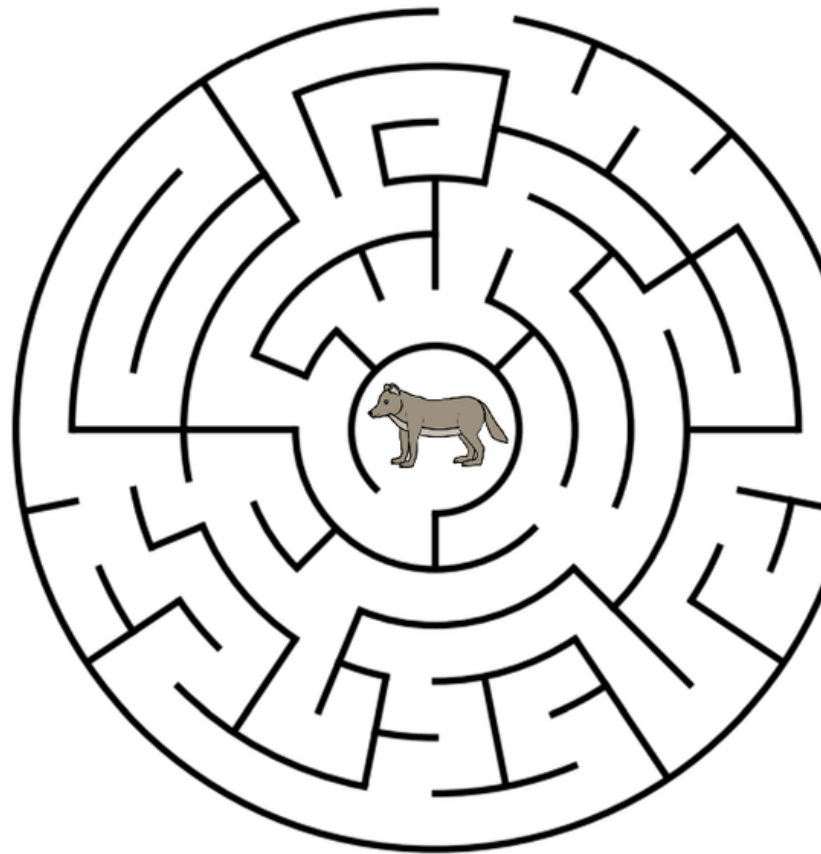
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There is a sorting activity looking at sentences that do and do not contain onomatopoeia. A color-coded option is included.



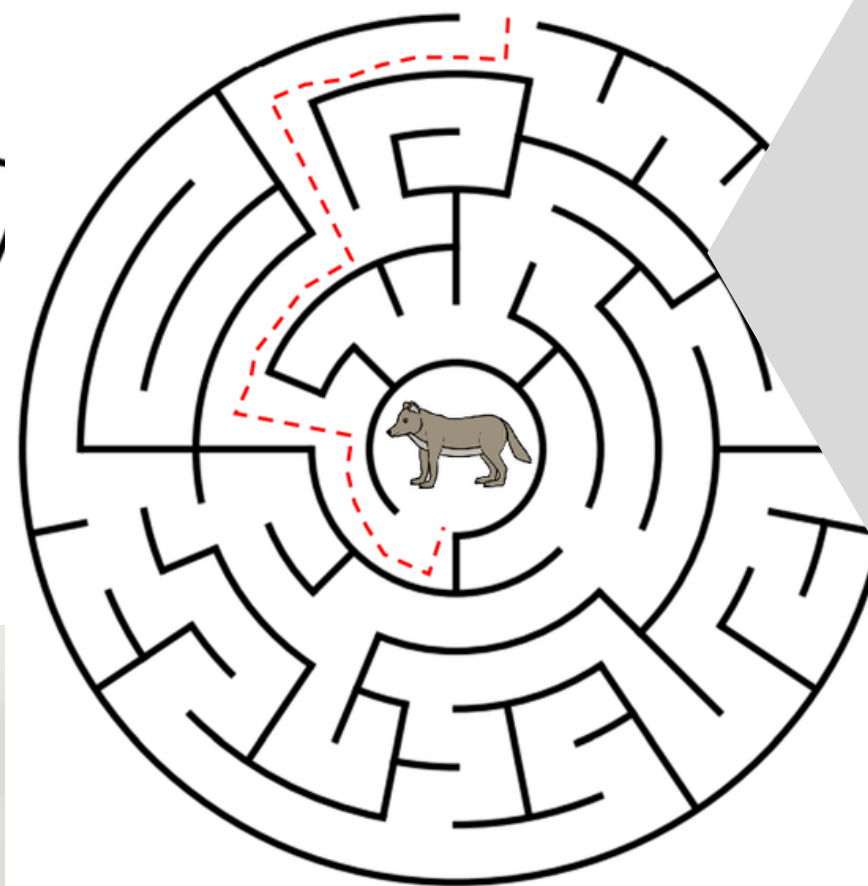
