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World War 2 Lesson Plan

Preparation

- · Print out a vocabulary board for each student to use throughout unit
 - o Laminate or place in page protector
- Book
 - o Print out, laminate, and bind
 - o OR your students can listen to the pre-recorded version
- Vocabulary cards
 - o Print out a set of cards onto cardstock and laminate
 - Make one set for each student and also one for the teacher to use in 1 Spy games
- · Print the large timeline cards on cardstock and laminate.

- Social story, "Why do I Need to Learn That?"
 - I would take the time and cost to print this out, laminate it, and bind it or place in a 3-ring binder. You will likely re-visit this story a lot during this lesson as well as other difficult topics you may teach throughout the year.

On September 1, 1939 Germany invaded Poland. It was at this point Great Britain realized Germany had to be stopped and they, along with France, declared war on Germany. World War II had begun.




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On June 6, 1944 the Allied forces sent over 150,000 soldiers into France to drive back the German troops. This huge victory over Germany became the turning point of the war. Here is how they did it.




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It was President Truman who made the decision to drop the atomic bombs on Japan that ended the war.



































































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This unit comes with a vocabulary board.

Every day students will do a group activity using these cards to get more familiar with words that are likely new to them.








- 2. Wrong answers mixed in that students will have to set aside.








There is a sorting activity looking at Allied vs Axis forces. There is a color-coded version included for students who need more support.




Watch the movie on World War 2


