
- Circle maps are a great way for students to see the concept at a glance. There are 2 versions: • One is errorless
 - One has wrong answers mixed in students will have to set aside






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There are 2 sorting activities: • bats/not bats • micrbats/megabats



Students will label parts of the bat. There is an option with words only and one with pictures. Suggestions for differentiation are




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There is a Venn diagram comparing bats and birds. This uses facts from the book. There is a color-coded option included (shown here).



There are 2 fill-in-theblank worksheets. This serves as the assessment in this unit.


