This unit comes with a vocabulary board.

Vocabulary boards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

Tips on how to use in the unit!!

(There are NO vocabulary cards in this unit.)

Ohio has the nickname, The Buckeye State. It is named for the nut that comes from the Buckeye tree (the state tree) that looks like a buck's eye.



There are 2 books (one for each week) with simple text and engaging photos.

One of the largest Oktoberfest festivals is held in Cleveland every year. You can enjoy lots of German food and drinks here, as well as dance to some polka music.



It comes in a PowerPoint version as well as an mp4 (movie) version.

Cut apart pictures and place in circle map about Ohio.



Cut apart pictures and place in circle map **ONLY IF** they relate to Ohio.



There is a circle map reviewing some main facts about Ohio.

Circle maps are a great way for students to see the concept at a glance. There are 2 versions:

- One is errorless
- One has wrong answers mixed in students will have to set aside

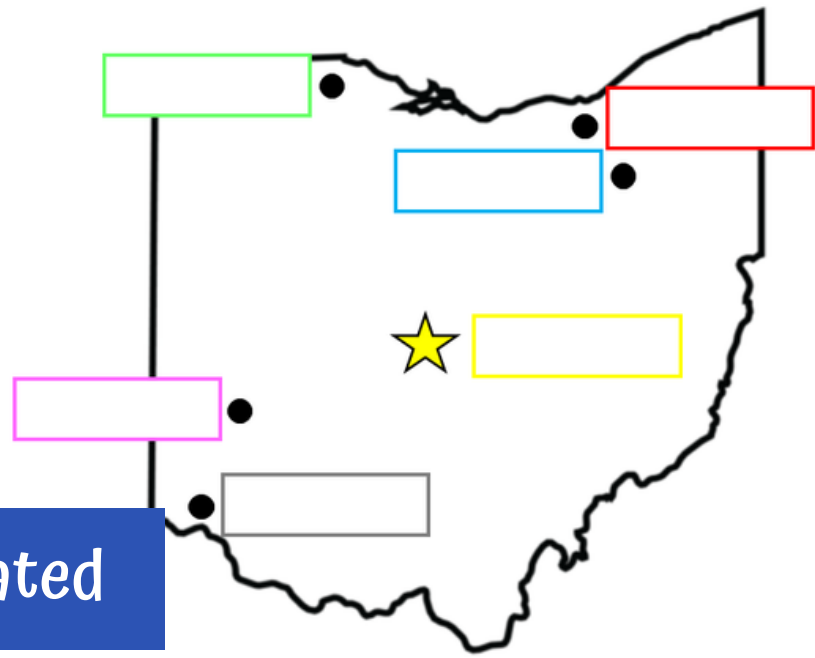

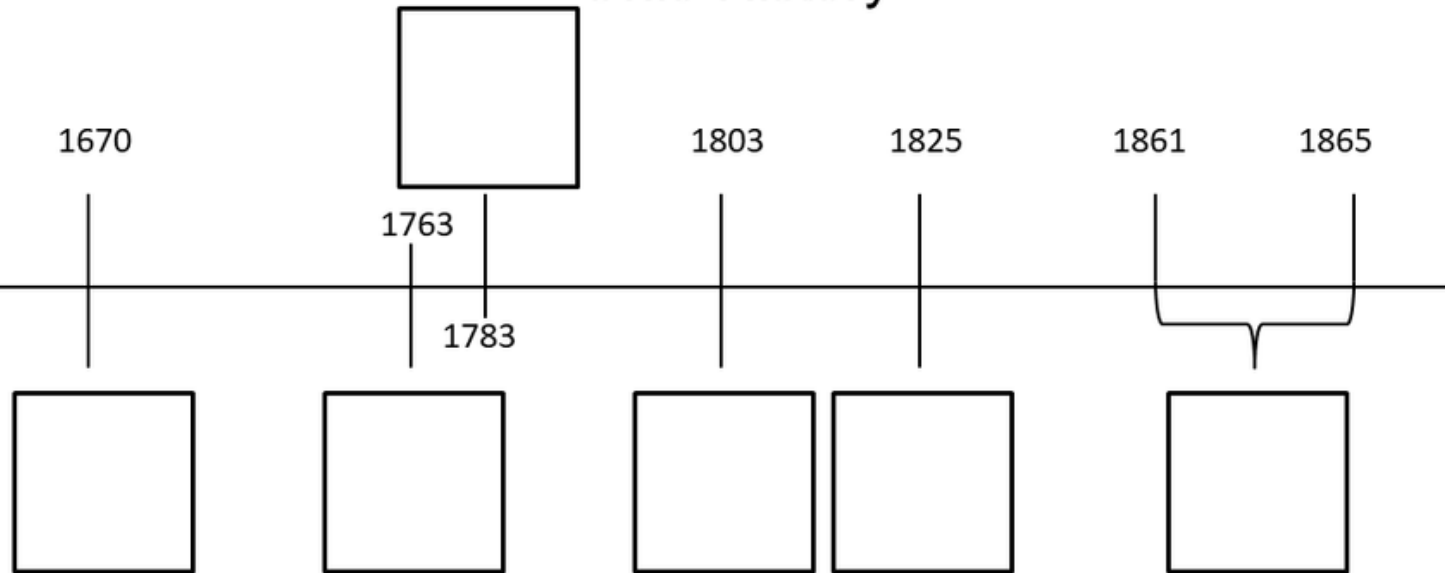

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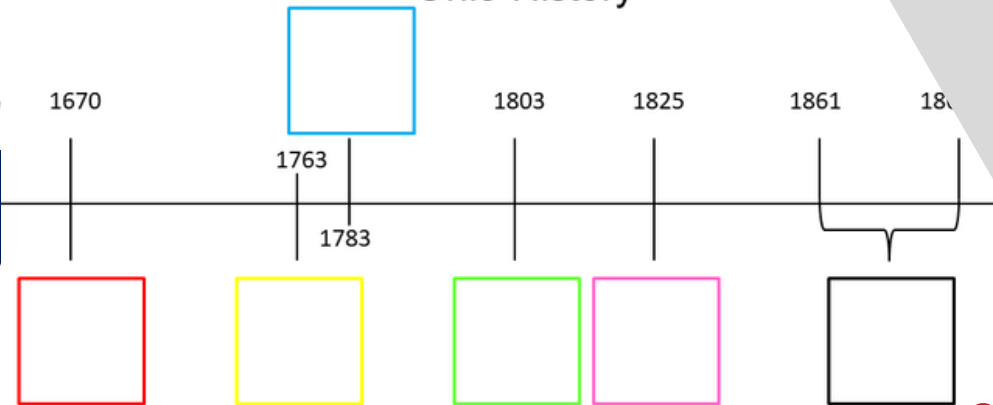

 - Point to a symbol on the vocabulary board
 - Verbally describe something about Ohio.
- Tell a story as though you were visiting Ohio.
 - What do you see?
 - What is the weather like?
 - What plants or animals do you see?
 - Where do you live (city or country)?
 - What are you eating?
 - What sports teams are playing in your area?

- Place the cards in page protectors or laminate for long term use.
- **Cut one board apart to use as calling cards.**
- This is a great way to practice the new vocabulary included in this unit.
- Cut apart a set of the vocabulary cards to use as the calling cards.
- Options:
 - Show students the picture for them to match
 - Read the definition and see if students can find the matching picture
 - Work as teams
 - Vary the "winning" patterns.
 - Cover all
 - Cover corners
 - Row across or down
 - Cover the edges
 - Vary the ways to mark the card
 - Place in page protector or laminate and use dry erase markers
 - Stickers
 - Post-it notes
 - Dot markers

Recipe



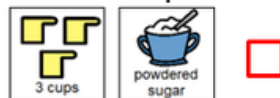
1. Mix the peanut butter and butter in a mixer.


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The second set of slides uses color for differentiation and extra support for students who may need it. Mix and match slides from both sets to make the perfect set for each student.
