

Humble Word Map– Use for chapter 18

- I like to use word maps when there is a concept or vocabulary word that I think most of my students will not know.
- This is an errorless task and uses few pictures than a circle map.
- Students will place synonyms for the unknown word in the empty circles.
- For the most advanced students, simply give them the word map and have them look in a dictionary or other source to find their own synonyms to write in the empty circles.
- This is one activity I like to do **BEFORE** reading the chapter so students can listen for the word, and will have a better understanding of its meaning in the context of the story.
