

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

Activity	Notes	Materials
Read or listen to the book: Massachusetts week 1 (10 minutes)	 Since this is the first-time students are seeing the book, I focus a lot on the pictures Ask lots of questions about what they might think the pictures mean or may relate to Make connections between book and vocabulary board (have students find relevant symbols on their boards to go with a concept or photo on page.) Go through the book twice, once just looking at the photos and a second time reading the story 	Book Vocabulary board
Vocabulary board <mark>I Spy</mark> <mark>Game</mark> (10 minutes)	 I play this game, or variations of it the first few days Since this is the first time playing this game, I make it easy. Hold up a symbol from the board, and have students find the matching one and point to it on their board 	 Vocabulary board cut apart Vocabulary board
Circle Map (10 minutes)	Do the circle map on Massachusetts O Choose the best version (errorless or not) depending on the learning level of your students O Students cut out symbols and place in circle map. Make connections to the book as necessary	Circle mapScissorsGlue
Sharing (10 minutes)	 Each student shares their circle map with the group using the communication method of their choice This repetition is so important. Students are hearing the relevant vocabulary when: Read the story Review the vocabulary board Complete the circle map Share the circle map 	Completed circle maps Communication devices










































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This unit comes with a vocabulary board.



























Circle maps are a great way for students to see the concept at a glance. There are 2 versions:

Students will identify how the climate and geography change across the state.











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













































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Who am I cards


- · Give each student a set of Who am I cards
- Various options/ways to play, but the goal is to have students hold up the card you are talking about. Sometimes there can be more than one correct answer
- · Things you can do:
 - · Hold up a who am I card
 - · Show a page from the book
 - · Point to a symbol on the vocabulary board
 - · Verbally describe something about Massachusetts.
- · Tell a story as though you were visiting Massachusetts.
 - · What do you see?
 - What is the weather like?
 - · What plants or animals do you see?
 - Where do you live (city or country)?
 - · What are you eating?
 - · What sports teams are playing in your area?





Bingo cards




- · Included are 10 Bingo cards in color and 10 Bingo cards in BW.
- · Place the cards in page protectors or laminate for long term use.
- Cut one board apart to use as calling cards.
- · This is a great way to practice the new vocabulary included in this unit.
- Cut apart a set of the vocabulary cards to use as the calling cards.
- · Options:
 - · Show students the picture for them to match
 - Read the definition and see if students can find the matching picture
 - · Work as teams
 - · Vary the "winning" patterns.
 - · Cover all
 - Cover corners
 - · Row across or down
 - · Cover the edges
 - Vary the ways to mark the card
 - · Place in page protector or laminate and use dry erase markers
 - Stickers
 - · Post-it notes
 - · Dot markers



6. Wait, then eat


















The second set of slides uses color for differentiation and extra support for students who may need it. Mix and match slides from both sets to make the perfect set for each student.
