- Things you can do:
 - Hold up a who am I card

 - Point to a symbol on the vocabulary board
 - Verbally describe something about South Carolina.
- Tell a story as though you were visiting South Carolina.
 - What do you see?
 - What is the weather like?
 - What plants or animals do you see?
 - Where do you live (city or country)?


- Included are 10 Bingo cards in color and 10 Bingo cards in BW.
