Polar Bears Lesson Plan

Preparation

- Print out a vocabulary board for each student to use throughout unit

Preassessment (do day 1 before starting lesson)

- . Use the fact sheet to assess what your students may already know
- I cannot emphasize enough how important this step is. If you want to see growth, this preassessment is so important!!

Teaching Tips

- Color Coding: this is a really easy way to add more structure to a matching activity. Outline or color in an empty box or sorting label. Outline or color in the corresponding picture symbols the same colors. Becomes a color matching task.

Fact sheet (5 minutes)	 As a group read through the fact sheet on polar bears 	Fact sheet








Each unit comes with circle maps to review the main facts from the book. There is an errorless version and a version with wrong answers mixed in.
