Read or listen to the book: Illinois week 1 (10 minutes)	 Since this is the first-time students are seeing the book, 1 focus a lot on the pictures Ask lots of questions about what they might think the pictures mean or may relate to Make connections between book and vocabulary board (have students find relevant symbols on their boards to go with a concept or photo on page.) Go through the book twice, once just looking at the photos and a second time reading the story 	 Book Vocabulary board

Sharing (10 minutes)	 Each student shares their circle map with the group using the communication method of their choice This repetition is so important. Who am I cards

- · Give each student a set of Who am I cards
- · Various options/ways to play, but the goal is to have students hold up the card you are talking about. Sometimes there can be more than one correct answer
- Things you can do:
 - Hold up a who am I card
 - Show a page from the book
 - · Point to a symbol on the vocabulary board
 - · Verbally describe something about Illinois.
- · Tell a story as though you were visiting Illinois.
 - What do you see?
 - What is the weather like?
 - What plants or animals do you see?
 - Where do you live (city or country)?
 - What are you eating?
 - What sports teams are playing in your area?
