
#### Day 1

Activity	Notes	Materials
Read or listen to the book: lowa week 1 (10 minutes)	<ul> <li>Since this is the first-time students are seeing the book, I focus a lot on the pictures         <ul> <li>Ask lots of questions about what they might think the pictures mean or may relate to</li> </ul> </li> <li>Make connections between book and vocabulary board (have students find relevant symbols on their boards to go with a concept or photo on page.)</li> <li>Go through the book twice, once just looking at the photos and a second time reading the story</li> </ul>	Book     Vocabulary     board
Vocabulary board I Spy Game (10 minutes)	<ul> <li>I play this game, or variations of it the first few days</li> <li>Since this is the first time playing this game, I make it easy. Hold up a symbol from the board, and have students find the matching one and point to it on their board</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Vocabulary board cut apart</li> <li>Vocabulary board</li> </ul>
Circle Map (10 minutes)	<ul> <li>Do the circle map on lowa</li> <li>Choose the best version (errorless or not) depending on the learning level of your students</li> <li>Students cut out symbols and place in circle map.</li> <li>Make connections to the book as necessary</li> </ul>	<ul><li>Circle map</li><li>Scissors</li><li>Glue</li></ul>
Sharing (10 minutes)	<ul> <li>Each student shares their circle map with the group using the communication method of their choice</li> <li>This repetition is so important. Students are hearing the relevant vocabulary when:         <ul> <li>Read the story</li> <li>Review the vocabulary board</li> <li>Complete the circle map</li> <li>Share the circle map</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Completed circle maps     Communication devices

















































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
This unit comes with a vocabulary board.








There is a circle map reviewing some main facts about lowa.


Circle maps are a great way for students to see the concept at a glance. There are 2 versions:

- One has wrong answers mixed in students will have to set aside






















































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

Students will complete 2 matching activities that look at landmarks and famous people.
























There is a writing prompt for students to write about taking a trip to see lowa. This is an errorless activity.











#### Who am I cards

- · Give each student a set of Who am I cards
- · Various options/ways to play, but the goal is to have students hold up the card you are talking about. Sometimes there can be more than one correct answer
- Things you can do:
  - · Hold up a who am I card
  - Show a page from the book
  - · Point to a symbol on the vocabulary board
  - · Verbally describe something about lowa.
- · Tell a story as though you were visiting lowa.
  - What do you see?
  - What is the weather like?
  - What plants or animals do you see?
  - · Where do you live (city or country)?





There are large cards and directions for playing a "Who am I?" group activity.







### Bingo cards




- Included are 10 Bingo cards in color and 10 Bingo cards in BW.
- · Place the cards in page protectors or laminate for long term use.
- Cut one board apart to use as calling cards.
- · This is a great way to practice the new vocabulary included in this unit.
- · Cut apart a set of the vocabulary cards to use as the calling cards.
- · Options:
  - · Show students the picture for them to match
  - · Read the definition and see if students can find the matching picture
  - · Work as teams
  - · Vary the "winning" patterns.
    - · Cover all
    - · Cover corners
    - · Row across or down
    - · Cover the edges
  - · Vary the ways to mark the card
    - · Place in page protector or laminate and use dry erase markers
    - · Stickers
    - · Post-it notes
    - · Dot markers










## Group activity


Color in the states using the key.
