Read or listen to a recording of the PowerPoint (15 minutes)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Since this is the first time students are seeing the PowerPoint, I focus a lot on the pictures <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask lots of questions about what they might think the pictures mean or may relate to Make connections between PowerPoint and vocabulary board (have students find relevant symbols on their boards to go with a concept or photo on page.) Go through the PowerPoint twice, once just looking at the photos and a second time reading the story 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> PowerPoint Vocabulary board
Vocabulary board (5 minutes)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This first day, I am just introducing and allowing the students to explore/look at the board Make connections between vocabulary board and PowerPoint 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Vocabulary board
Fact sheet	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review the fact sheet on Eleanor Roosevelt Read through each statement and have student follow along on their own fact sheet Do the circle map on Eleanor Roosevelt <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose the best version (errorless or not) depending on the learning level of your students Students cut out symbols and place in circle map Make connections to the PowerPoint as necessary Each student shares their circle map with the group using the communication method of their choice 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fact sheet Circle map Scissors Glue Completed circle maps Communication devices
