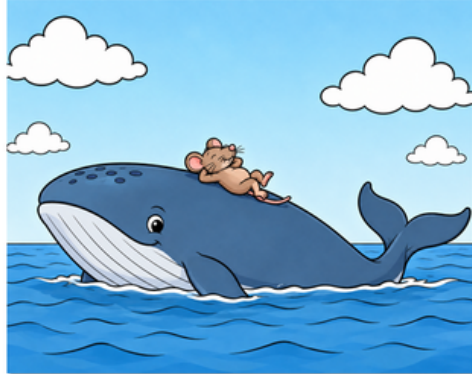

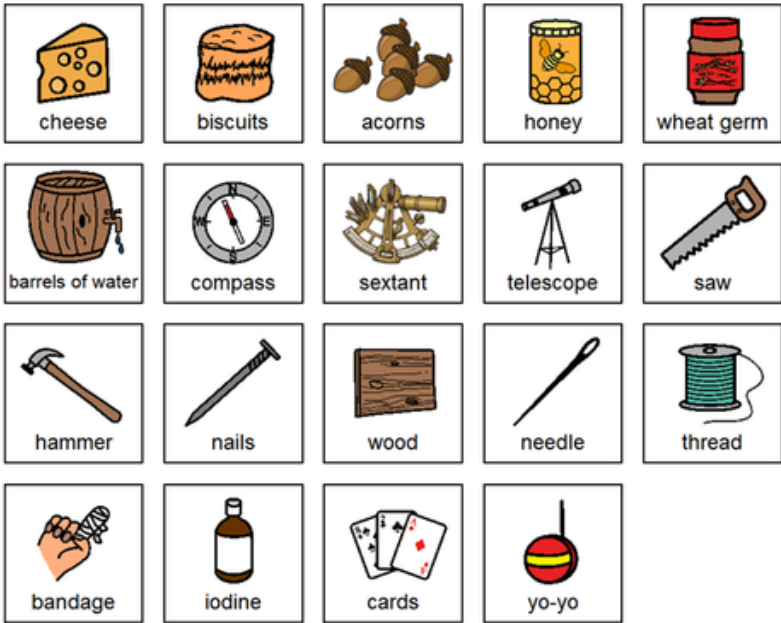


ERRORLESS

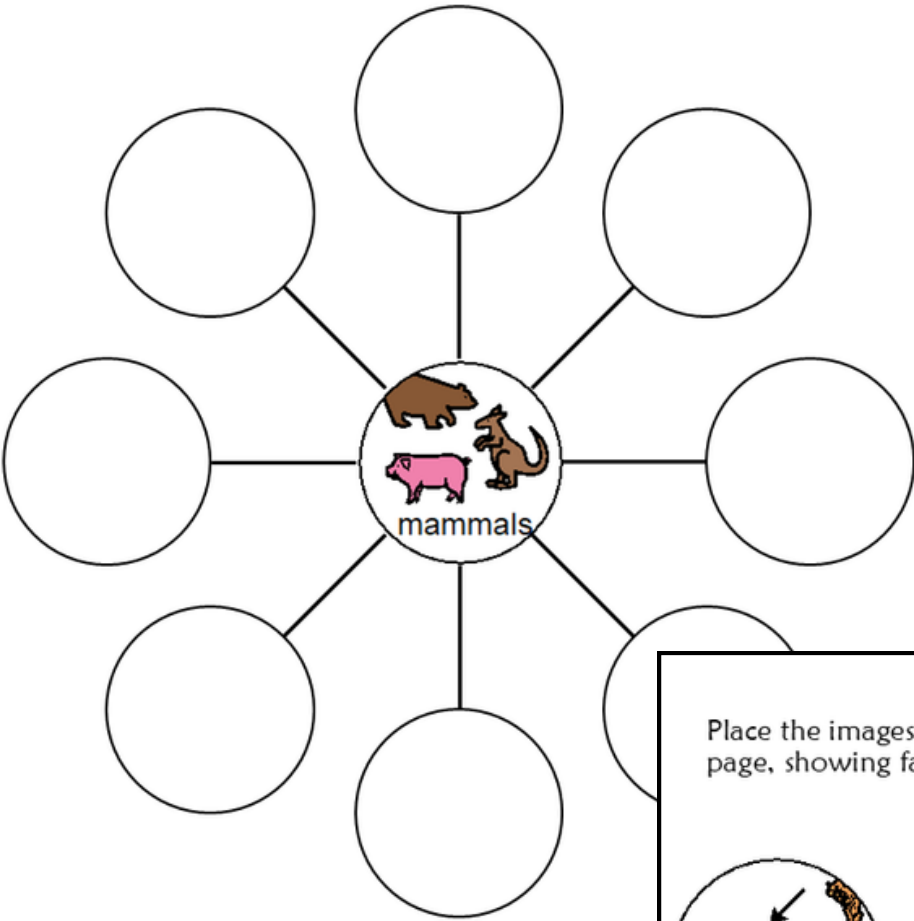
Students will glue pictures of all the things Amos took with him on his trip.

Place the images below into the word map on the previous page, showing facts about mammals.



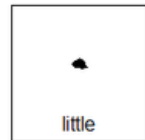
There is a word map on some of the common characteristics of mammals.
